**HOWARD COLLEGE!**  
At the request of the Board of Trustees, the following facts are presented to the friends of Howard College:  
1st. It is highly important that the business of the College should be resumed as early as practicable. They have, therefore, resolved to reopen it  
On Monday the 2d day of October next.  
2d. The endowment fund is almost entirely unavailable for the present. To what extent it has permanently suffered is unknown. Hence the necessity of planning for the present, as nearly as possible, upon a self-supporting basis. It will require the tuition of all its students to meet its current expenses. The Trustees, therefore, appeal to the holders of Scholarships to waive their rights for the present, so that the College may be able to resume its exercises.  
3d. They also appeal to those who are indebted to the College, and who are unable to pay at least the interest due upon their Notes, to let their Notes remain unpaid for the present, so that the College may be able to resume its exercises.  
4th. They further appeal to the Church and friends of Ministerial Education, to do what they can for the support of "Beneficial Societies."  
5th. Applicants of suitable age to become subjects of College discipline, will be admitted, whether prepared for the regular classes or not.
