**JIM**, a stout built fellow, about 20 years of age, five feet eight inches high, keeps one of his eyes about half shut, has rather a down look and speaks slow when spoken to,—he wore off a blue broad cloth coat.



**WIGGIN**, a stout built fellow, about twenty-two years of age, five feet eight inches high, has a down look when spoken to, one of his fore teeth out, and wore off a blue broad cloth coat.

The above reward will be given for the apprehension and delivery of said slaves to me, or secure them in any jail so I get them again, or so much in proportion for either of them. I am disposed to think they are aiming for some of the free states.
