# H. R. 3352

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. BOYKIN introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

## A BILL

For the relief of Emeline Lartigue.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*  
3 That the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed  
4 to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise  
5 appropriated, to Emeline Lartigue, of Mobile, Alabama,  
6 the sum of \$405.10. The payment of such sum shall be in  
7 full settlement of all claims of the said Emeline Lartigue  
8 against the United States arising out of the damage to her  
9 automobile, which, on August 26, 1946, was struck at an  
10 intersection in the city of Mobile, Alabama, by an Army  
11 staff car operated by an enlisted man who was acting outside

1 the scope of his employment: *Provided*, That no part of  
2 the amount appropriated in this Act in excess of 10 per  
3 centum thereof shall be paid or delivered to or received by  
4 any agent or attorney on account of services rendered in  
5 connection with this claim, and the same shall be unlawful,  
6 any contract to the contrary notwithstanding. Any person  
7 violating the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty  
8 of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined  
9 in any sum not exceeding \$1,000.

A BILL

For the relief of Lincoln Paragon

1 It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,  
3 That the Secretary of the Treasury is authorized and directed  
4 to pay, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise  
5 appropriated to Lincoln Paragon of Mobile, Alabama,  
6 the sum of \$100.00. The payment of such sum shall be in  
7 full satisfaction of all claims of the said Lincoln Paragon  
8 against the United States arising out of the damage to his  
9 automobile which on August 20, 1910, was struck at an  
10 intersection in the City of Mobile, Alabama, by an Army  
11 car operated by an enlisted man who was riding outside
