I have received your telegram with reference to the Kellogg Peace Pact. While I am not ready at this time to state definitely just what my position will be, I am inclined to vote for the treaty. My opinion is based not on the belief that this treaty will outlaw war or guarantee peace, but that it seems to be a gesture in that direction. The reservations opposed to the treaty have just been submitted to the Senate, and I have not had the opportunity to study them carefully. I am in favor of immediate action, however, and I trust that the question will be disposed of before the Christmas holidays. I assure you that I am very glad indeed to have the views of the organization which you represent. I assure you also that I am whole-heartedly in favor of any movement which, in my judgment, tends to reduce the possibilities of war.
