

New Brunswick now December 15th 1862
Dear wife I seat my self to drag you
a few lines to let you know that I
am well again these few lines may find
you and the children will I receive a
letter from you a few minutes as you
write give me great satisfaction to hear from
you and to hear that you was well
you put to me that you had moved
but you never put when you had moved
I have note to you in every letter
for you to right to me when you have
move to but you haven't note it yet
I want you to be share to right to me
in your next letter when you have move
to Martha we have a general review
yesterday since we was review by our
prezident J. P. Davis he is a good looking
man it was a pretty beam to look
at Martha we draw money to day
and I will send it to you as soon
as I can it we go to mobile I will
bring it home if there is sum talk
of us going to mobile I here that
we will go to mobile I want you
to right to me whether you have
heard from Dick Thoring or not
whether he is dead or not for
I want to hear when he is

I don't think that we will have
enough fighting to do here for I think
we will move from here before long
you must get right to me soon

Dear Wife I seat my self to drop you a few lines to let you know that I am well hope these few lines may find you and the children well I receve a letter from you a few minutes a go witch give me great satisfation to hear from you and to her that you was well You rot to me that you had moved but you never rot wher you had moved to I have rote to you in every letter for you to right to me when you have move to but you havent rote it yet I want you to be shure to right to me in your next letter wher you have move to Martha we had a jenral revew yesterday and we wer reviewed by our prezedent Jef Davis he is a good looken man It were a pretty sean to look at Martha we draw money to day and I will send it to you as soon as I can if we go to Mobile I will bring it home thar is some talk of us going to Mobile I hope that we will go to Mobile I want you to right to me wether you have herd from Dick Thoring or not wether he is dead or not for I want to her wher he is

Dont think that we will have any fighting to Do her for I think we will move from her befor long you must right to me soon Direct your letters to Murfreeburrow Tenn Co G 34th Ala Vo.

So nothing more at prezent only remain your beloved Husban untill Death
