
## CUBA REDS PUSH RACIAL UNREST

The Cuban Communists are pushing racial unrest throughout the South over the most powerful radio station in the world. Utilizing the 100,000 watt transmitter of Radio Progreso, the Castro government slants its "Radio Free Dixie" program to Negroes in the Southern United States five nights a week.

The programs, which are directed by Robert Williams, a North Carolina Negro labor leader, calls on the Negroes to take a more militant stand for further socialization of the American system – and advocates any means, violence or otherwise, to bring on these social reforms.

**CASTRO SPREADS THE COMMUNIST REVOLT!**

Williams, who defected to Cuba in late 1959, is wanted on a kidnaping charge in North Carolina. He has shaped and moulded Radio Progreso (730 kilocycles) to one of the most effective propaganda media in the world, second only to Radio Moscow.

Take a typical broadcast. It is easily picked up in most areas of the South with Florida, Alabama, Georgia and Mississippi being the best reception areas. In other areas, the program can be tuned on a harmonic of the original wave length at 680 kilocycles. A fine tuner may be necessary in some cases where powerful local stations are on the same band.

The hour long show (10 p.m. EST) is narrated in English by a sexy-voiced Negress who begins by stating flatly:

"This program is dedicated to all the decent people of the Bloody Southland, and to those who want to enjoy the social freedoms that have been established here in Cuba."

As the tempo of the Afro-American jazz music picks up, the woman's delicately disguised pleas for a general uprising among the American Negroes become more demanding.

"As you sit in your second rate home tonight, try and remember how much money you earned for your master today, slave," she says sweetly with just a touch of acid. "How much was your share? In a socialist country, your share would have been equal and you would not have a master."

"If you are tired of being a second class citizen do something about it," she says. "Strike out at the White man. Shake loose your shackles. There are many groups which are working for you join these. Remember your brothers in Cuba are with you."

The program breaks off in a wild desertation of a Calypso song.

This is just one of the several "Radio Free ...." programs broadcast in Spanish, English, French and Portuguese. Obviously copies from the "Radio Free Europe" and "Voice of America" formats, they are beamed into the Western Hemisphere republics 18 hours a day. The electronic power of Cuban Radio stations is frightening and awesome. According to U.S. Rep. William Cramer, R-Fla., any one of the seven broadcast stations could be used to knock a missile from Cape Kennedy off course and could possibly cause a catastrophe.

U.S. transmitters compare at less than half the wattage. Our most powerful stations broadcast at 50,000 watts.

Also featured was Jerry Buchanan, director of men's activities, who told the Story Behind the Brigade.



## **CUBA EXPORTS RED REVOLT**

The picture on the front page and the one on this page show the evidence which concluded the Organization of American States charges that Castro is exporting his revolution to other American republics.

In a report to the American press last fall, the International Anti-Communist Brigade warned that the bearded dictator was shipping in arms and sabotage equipment to Venezuela among other Latin American countries. The Brigade reported that a cache of Cuban weapons was stored on a beach on the north South American Coast. In November, 1963, a cache was discovered and the Brigade identified certain markings on the weapons which were known to be used in the Cuban revolution against Batista.

The NATO machine gun, Belgium-made 7.62 mm, was identified by the rear sling holder and 26th of July (Castro's original rebels) insignia on the receiver. The pile of equipment is part of the cache which could have armed "a small army" and possibly have intimidated last December's elections which historically shamed the Communists for the first time since MacArthur wanted to invade Red China during the Korean War.

### COMMIES TAKE NEW STAB AT DOMINICAN

HAVANA – Brigade agents here say that Castro is getting set to take a new stab at the Dominican Republic which narrowly escaped a sellout last year by the overthrow of the Juan Bosch government.

A group of young men from Santo Domingo arrived here in mid-February for training in sabotage and guerilla warfare. The group is presently quartered in the Hotel Lincoln on Calle Virtudes, awaiting orientation by Russian and Cuban instructors.

### TELL THE TRUTH . . .

Q. Are many of the Cuban exiles coming to this country really Castro Communist spies? – K.B., Daphne, Ala.

A. The Kennedy Administration made a deal with Fidel Castro in 1962, allowing the bearded dictator to pick half of the refugees who came to this country as part of the Bay of Pigs ransom deal. During January, 1963, a total of 7,847 exiles from Cuba landed at Fort Lauderdale and Miami as a result of the exchange and Castro picked half. In addition, 271 persons on the freedom ships were not Cubans. (Anyone may send questions to this department.)
