My own Sweet Pet

I received yesterday yours  
mailed the 1<sup>st</sup> Inst. and my Darling I felt  
so badly when I read it and found that you  
had not received my letters and that you  
were thinking that I had forgotten you or  
was neglecting you - My Pet I have been two  
weeks to-morrow as the usual phrase is and  
in that time I have written at least ten  
or twelve letters - I have sent letters to you  
every time any one has left here for  
Infanta besides mailing some five or  
six - I sent a letter by Dr Ferry - by Ramsey  
by Cap - by Woods by Boatright - by Dawson  
I believe I shall not send any more that  
way - but I will mail them all for the future

They don't deliver them - that must be the  
way - This much Darling as an apology - and  
Nannie when you do not receive letters will you  
not attribute the cause to something else and  
not to the want of affection or love on the  
part of your old dear - Nannie You know I love  
you - Why then Darling should I through a  
little carelessness or negligence make you feel  
lonely and desolate - Darling will not this

letter keep you from feeling so badly - Well I feared  
I will talk of something else - It is early  
this morning the mail closes at 9 o'clock  
and I must hurry - Breakfast is not ready  
I got up early to write to you - I was up  
last night hauling cannon until half past  
12 o'clock - We moved three cannon yesterday to a  
sand battery - one from Barrancas and two from  
the navy yard - Instead of moving them on  
skids as I wrote we would be compelled to  
do - we got them on truck wheels and pulled  
them through the sand - one of them weighed 3000  
lbs - and the wheels buried some 12 or 18 inches  
in the sand in some places - so you may im-  
agine what sort of heavy pulling it was -  
Our men work well and cheerfully - The news from  
Washington is considered warlike and excites  
considerable commotion - Forney did not go to  
Montgomery after all - he stopped in Pensacola  
and went to work getting up sack bags and  
flannel for cartridges - Baker also turned  
back and is now here - Boatright left here  
yesterday morning - I sent a letter to you - his  
wife is sick in the season he got a furlough -  
There is considerable variety of opinion here  
in reference to the President's message - Some  
think it means war others think differently  
For my own part I think if we want to get  
possession of Pickens that we will have

to fight for it - and that is my chief concern  
just now - and further I would not be  
surprised if Lincoln should attempt to  
reoccupy the public property here - If he  
does and waits ten days or two weeks  
we will give him a respectable fight and  
with any thing like equality we will whip  
his army and hold the property - Nannie  
my darling I am beginning to think that  
our time here is very uncertain - We may remain  
here for the whole twelve months - I have made  
up my mind to any thing and will try and be  
prepared for it - I have plenty of work Nannie  
plenty of it - and when you do not receive letters  
from me just think of my being up  
pulling cannon until 12 1/2 o'clock at night  
and being so busy during the day as not  
to have time for any thing that would  
occupy me an hour - Give my  
love to all the family - I must hasten  
to close - I have had breakfast and it  
is getting time for me to go to my work - I  
am not my own man now Darling - I have  
to obey the orders of superior officials - and just  
here permit me to say that take out Forney  
and I would not give a dried apple for  
three-fourths of the balance - But Forney  
conducts the whole affair and I depend  
on him for every thing - Well my dearest

I must go good by god bless you my  
Darling. Now Nannie please drop that  
part of your letter saying that you are  
afraid you annoy me by your long  
letters. and don't Darling please talk  
about my being so busy that I will  
not have time to read them and all  
that - It grates on my feelings Nannie  
and makes me feel unpleasant  
The weather is fine good by my  
love to all as ever your own  
devoted and loving Hubert
