Dear Edward.

Your letter of Oct. 6th was rec^d.

Wallingford Vt. I am very sorry for your loss of money

at present and probably shall be till some favorable turn
takes place - Charley is in want of winter clothing - and
must have coat & pants immediately (and other things) -

returned from the Depo. with the basket of crockery
