Dear Mother

You will see by the date
of my letter where we are. Exgar Ke-
now, who was wounded and taken
prisoner during Wheeler's raid, is
now going home, so I write.

We had a pretty hard fight at
Franklin on the 3rd ult. In which
we were victorious. But our
loss was very heavy. more in fact
than the Yankees as we charged
them in their breast-works. Maj
Gen Clburne and seven ⁽⁷⁾ Brigadiers
were killed. Starks Chief was
shot through the calf of his leg.

The enemy is now inside his
fortifications at Nashville. Don't
know whether or not we will
attack them. It is reported and
believed that they have evacuated
Decatur and Huntville. Purley
is enjoying general very good health
Off duty and all the boys are

doing well. Henry Pray has not
yet arrived. Fanny is all right with
the exception of a sore back. But
Tecumseh has gone up and I
left him at Mt. Phasant 13 miles
south of Columbia. have picked
up an old horse which will do to
ride. Love to all etc from P -

Dear Mother

You will see by the date of my letter where we are. Edgar Lenoir, who was wounded and taken prisinor during Wheeler's raid, is here going home, so I write.

We had a pretty hard fight at Franklin on the ^{30th} 3rd ult. In which we were victorious. But our loss was very heavy, more in fact that the yankees as we charged them in their breast-words. Maj Genl Cleburne and seven (7) Brigadiers were killed. Starke Oliver was shot through the calf of his leg. The enemy is now inside his fortifications at Nashville. Dont know, whether or not we will attack them. It is reported and believed that they have evacuated Decatur and Huntsville. Charley is enjoying very good health J W Lang and all the boys are doing well. Henry Cravy has not yet arrived. Fanny is all right with the exception of a sore ~~back~~. But Tecumpseh has gone up, and I left him at Mt Pleasant 13 miles south of Columbia, have picked up an old horse which will do to ride. Love to all ditto from C--
