Nov 10th 1861

My dear father

I received your last letter & also one enclosed from Laura yesterday evening about dark. Col. Wilkinson & cousin William Hall are here and brought 3 bottles things safe, so he told me to tell you, and that he is very much obliged to you for them. We also got the money for which we are very much obliged to you. I only wish one thing now, at least until we go into winter quarters, and that is a copy of Hardie's Tactics, which I wish you would send me if you have an opportunity

Lieut. Kirkpatrick told me
yesterday he had a bill
against me for my uniform.
I don't understand it. I
thought you settled with
Capt Fair for it, but if not
of course all right. I can
pay for it. Please write me
whether you payed for it &
how much, so I will know
what to do. I have been at
camp two or three days
recruiting. Crenshaw is at
the hospital waiting upon
Frank. We have telegra-
phed home about him, so
that Mr Perry Rives or Cousin
Gom or could come on
and attend to Frank. He
does not get any better. He
has a terrible swelling upon
one jaw which bursted
a few days since on the inside
and run a great deal. He is
very thin & weak. and still

does not eat any thing. I think
as soon as the Swell upon his
jaw gets well he will recover
Our regiment goes out on picket
again to day (Sunday) but I
believe our company & the
Antigua Rifles will stay
at camp this time for camp
guard. I am very sorry you
have been sick. I hope your
health will improve this
winter. We are all well.
I shall write to Laura & Carrie
in a day or two tell them. Kiss
Carrie for me. My love to all
the family
