Dear Sir - When I left your house Thursday morning, I found all the negroes at the Rail Road Depot except William. I suppose he was determined to stay with Mr. Powell, whether I was willing or not. As I told you, Powell may have the negro at \$2500. Enclosed in this I send a line to him, which you will be kind enough to hand him. If Powell will not give that amount for him, he may hire him until I come up in November. Our white family are all well. Eddy is doing as well as could be expected. He will go up to see Bolley as soon as he is able. I still have several sick negroes. Eddy's wound pains him a good deal, and several small bones are working out, but I think he is doing very well.
