I have opportunity to write a few lines and will send it down by a sick man to get it delivered as there is no post office here; I was not hurt in the battle and am well. I have not been able to hear from Crenshaw and John since the battle. I am pretty certain they were in the fight. They were ordered to East Linn but were ordered back time enough to be in the battle. As soon as I can hear any thing - will let you know. All of my men killed and wounded are prisoners. I don't know whether all were wounded or not. Capt. W. M. Wagner & P. R. Hubbard & privates J. W. Barnes L. W. & J. N. Fox, L. A. Chambliss, J. Driver, L. W. Hurst, W. W. Smith, J. M. Linnar, J. Hatch, F. Bauderslee, and Lt. Northrup are all in the hands of the enemy. I can't say whether killed or wounded. Private R. P. Mills, John Driver & Toll. Wood are slightly wounded but still with the company for duty. My men fought very well. Your affec son

Autaugaville, Ala. Nov. 18<sup>th</sup> 1863.

Dear Captain,

I write to inform you that my brother and S. J. Hurst are still confined to their beds from the wounds received at Chickamauga. They both have had very serious times in consequence of the sloughing of their wounds and it will be many weeks before they will be able for duty. They have had their furloughs extended by the Board at Montgomery for thirty days dating from the 16<sup>th</sup> Inst.
