war. I dread the influence that
very favorable propositions for peace
from the conservative party of the
north upon the basis of reconstruc-
tion might have upon us, I fear
that such divisions thereby might
be produced among us as will bring
about a union with free states
that would in the course of time
produce the same results that are
now afflicting us.

Peace is truly desirable but a perma-
nent peace if to be more difficult
in procuring should be insisted upon
and no terms submitted too that
would incorporate an element hostile
to our future quiet and security.

Owing to pressing engagements I cannot
write more. Will spend a night with
