Dear Father,

As we are reacting here we

found that "Hilliard's Legion" had

left a few days previous. An acquaintance

of mine, saw Bolling & told

him that our Regt was expected here soon.

They are now near Knoxville. Every

thing indicates an early movement

on our part. I received yours with

the enclosed ~~from~~ to Genl. Withers

several days ago. I have seen him

and handed the letter. He promised

to favor it & the application & I have

sent it up. I expect that it has

been through the hands of Chalmers

& Withers. I hope Chalmers did not

disapprove it. Genl. Bragg I fear

most. Genl. Withers told me to send

your letter along with the application

which I have done. Unless we march

very soon I will hear from the ap-

plication in a few days, and will

write to you immediately.

Lyon & myself are enjoying good health
we are on short rations at present,
I have been under arrest together
with other officers in the Regt
since yesterday, Our arrest con-
tinues till this evening.

It is ordered that a company shall
at all times have a commissioned
officer present. At Pollard Myrick
& Wood had absented themselves
from the company in the
morning, in the evening I
thought that they had returned
as two as their duty to have re-
turned long before, any how I was
told that they had gotten back, &
I left the company for a short time,
In that time, Colo Moore visited the
company & found no officers
present, This was the cause of
my arrest. Many cases similar
to this have occurred in the Regt.

we have heard, you will not

soon. Tom has written twice.
I hope to be able to say in my
next that the application for
a transfer had been granted.
