Unconditional release of innocent Scotsboro boys.

Full protection of these boys, and the immediate disbanding of boss lynch gangs.

For Negro and White workers on jury work.

We are fully aware that the prosecution deliberately stimulated race hatred and mob-lynch spirit which made the rendering of a sane and fair verdict impossible, in the case Haywood Patterson.

Today the good State of Alabama stands indicted in the eyes of the World for its attempt to send these boys to the electric chair on frame-up charges and totally lacking in evidence for conviction.

Therefore implore you to use every power of your good Office in releasing these innocent boys and the unconditional pardon of Haywood Patterson.
