THE MONTGOMERY LADIES.



Ed. Post:--Permit me through the columns of your paper, to offer, in behalf of the Moore Guards, a slight tribute of acknowledgment to the ladies of Montgomery, for their generosity and kindness to the soldiers and the lofty patriotism they have exhibited in the perilous times, through which we have been and are still passing. Most nobly have they sustained the cause of their country, by their clothing those who have been, called to fight her battles, and contributing to their comfort. They have cheerfully done all that patriotism and generosity could require of them. Every soldier that has left Montgomery for the seat of war, will remember them with gratitude and bless them in his "heart of hearts." "Never till life and memory perish" will we forget our obligations to them. Your correspondent especially desires to express his acknowledgments to Miss M. E. of your city.

But, Mr. Editor, while acknowledging the liberality and patriotism of the ladies of Montgomery, it pains me to say that some of the merchants of your city have not manifested the same spirit. We have found Shylocks among them--men who have shown a disposition to exact to the uttermost farthing of exorbitant and extortionate prices. So far from being liberal and generous to the soldiers they have looked upon them as proper subjects upon which to practice small tricks of petty meanness and extortion. I do not say this of all the merchants of Montgomery, but of a few only. To give you an example of the "self-sacrificing" patriotism on the part of a certain firm, from whom we purchased our uniforms. The ladies of Montgomery agreed to make up the pants for the Company for the pittance of five cents a pair, and to devote the money so obtained to the aid of the soldiers. This generous firm after charging us the full price (and a high price at that) for the cloth, refused to pay the five cents a pair for the pants, when applied to by the ladies. These

men I understand are Yankees by birth, and ~~thxkxk~~ therefore their want of generosity is not to be so much wondered at. I trust that the soldiers at least who rendezvous at Montgomery, will not in future patronize men (whether born at the North or South) whose avarice exceeds their patriotism. I could mention instances of petty exaction on the part of others in your city, but they are too small for notice in a newspaper. I trust for the fair fame of Montgomery, that the citizens will discountenance every attempt at extortion upon the soldiers. If extortion and meanness must be practiced, let them be practiced upon those who are too unpatricotic or too cowardly to fight the battles of their country.

OBITUARY.



Captain JAMES S. WILLIAMSON, of Lowndes county, Alabama, fell in the battle before Richmond, June 30th, 1862, aged 58 years.

As soon as the difficulties commenced between the North and South, he immediately devoted his energies to the Southern cause and for Southern Freedom. Gifted by nature with all the intellectual capacities necessary for a political man, he continued to devote them for his country's honor and rights.

At the first call of his country he willingly volunteered; offering himself if need be a bloody sacrifice upon thm its altar, to maintain its honor, its glory, its liberty and independence. As old age was slowly creeping upon him, his family and other friends endeavored to dissuade him from his project, as many younger than himself could repair to the scene of action.

But all the persuasion and entreaties of his loving wife and friends could not deter him from his store and noble resole in duty. He buckled on his armour and went forth a soldier, to battle for his country's rights. Being an especial favorite in his neighborhood by his eloquence he soon succeeded in raising a large company of brave men, who determined to share with their much loved leader and friend, all the dangers and privations incident to a soldier's life.

While at the camp of instruction, in Auburn, his family consisting of his wife and four bright promising little children visited him. Warmly attached to wife and children, this reunion brought him complete happiness, Often he would take his youngest, a cherub boy upon his knee and say "father's boy," while his paternal affectiens would overflow, and he would imprint kiss after kiss upon the pure brow of his darling babe.

Alas! in a few brief days the cold icy hand of death was placed upon this lovely flower thepet and pride of his heart. He was too pure, too angelic for this world, he was called home to dwell among the blessed. It was a great blow to us all when we heard that our darling "JIM WEBB" had

gone, and oh! how we pitied his bereaved parents, for they almost worshiped him. But God in his mercy gave them strength to bear their severe affliction and brought them to remember with ~~human~~ love and gratitude that in mercy they were still blessed with three promising children to cheer and comfort them.

Capt. WILLIAMSON served faithfully in the capacity of a soldier for more than a year, during this time he passed through many severe conflicts on such occasions ever exhibiting the most unflinching courage, firm, calm and collected bravery. Towards the end of the spring campaign, his health began to fail him, still he could not be persuaded to leave the service. At last he yielded to the advice of and resigned his position. When about to return to his happy home, where so many loving and eager hearts were awaiting his return, he learned a severe engagement was hourly anticipated before Richmond. Although he had in his possession his discharge, yet he would not leave the post of duty in such an hour, but determined to lead his men into battle and share with them victory or death.

During the series of engagements before Richmond, which lasted for seven days, all the field Officers of his Regiment (14th) were slain or wounded, the command devolved upon himself.

While nobly charging a redoubt a minnie ball pierced his heart-- he fell-- and never again spoke. His spirit had fled to a betterland.

The mournful tidings of his sad death, borne back to his wife, I will not attempt to describe the anguish of that hour. No pen can portray the crushing grief of those who have lost all that was dear on earth.

There was never a more noble self sacrificing benevolent man than dear brother JIM, he was always ready and willing to assist any who sought his aid.

We will never cease to regret and mourn his departure. He died a noble death, just as the brave love to die.

Long will his name be remembered and treasured by his countrymen, as one who had willingly sacrificed his life for Southern Independence. And his memory and noble deeds are a rich legacy for his bereaved and afflicted family.
