

# HISTORICAL SKETCH

Born out of the refusal of Mrs. Rosa Parks to relinquish her seat on a city bus on December 1, 1955 and the resultant despair and determination of 50,000 Negroes, who chose to walk with dignity rather than ride in shame, the Montgomery Improvement Association exemplifies a history unparalleled in the time-honored struggle for freedom and human dignity.

The Negro citizens of Montgomery, who had so dedicated themselves to the peaceful resistance of an evil system of segregation needed the guidance of men who were "no-strangers" to a struggle against social injustice.

This hard core leadership was provided by the officers and affiliates of the Montgomery Improvement Association.

With the dynamic and resourceful Martin Luther King, Jr. as its first president, the M.I.A. successfully sought desegregation of public transportation in this city.

In February, 1960, the M.I.A. in the truest tradition of unselfish devotion to the cause of racial equality, accepted the resignation of Dr. King so that he could broaden his area of operation for racial equality. Though the M.I.A., of course, regretted the loss of Dr. King, but with the selection of Dr. Ralph D. Abernathy as his competent successor, it continued to move forward in its bid for freedom and democracy for all men irrespective of racial origin.

It successfully sought an injunction against enforced racial segregation in the public parks of Montgomery; it has preserved its entity through a storm of racial unrest, and yet has had power to touch with healing unity its passions and tragedies; it has mitigated much social injustice; it has enlarged and protected the basic rights of man; it has increased kindness and gentleness and thus diminished the fury inherent with racial inequality; it has developed a touching and almost sublime faith in the power of passive resistance; it has met and survived the many crises that are likely to assail organizations similar in purpose and it is cleaner today in ruling passion, in motive, and in practice than ever before.

The brief but exciting history of the M.I.A. has truly been a panorama of lights and shadows, of achievements, yes sometimes of failure. It has exhibited the tenseness and determination inherent in a bid for freedom, as they marvelously transform and affect the lives of men. It has also exhibited those passions and weaknesses of which human nature is capable. Its tasks, with every moment, have seemed almost insuperable. Never, however, have they been greater than at present, when the furnace of racial tension bids fair to transform the whole fabric of our society. Yet no one can survey the history of the M.I.A. without unyielding confidence in its future. Its changes may and perhaps shall be many; its struggles shall continuously be great; but the power, determination, and purpose which had led it hitherto, shall guide it to a larger usefulness in the advancement of the cause of human dignity and freedom.
