

Oxford N.C. May 11<sup>th</sup> 1863.

Dear Sis

I wrote you last week under the cruel suspense of ignorance of our brother's fate in the recent battle - I hope yr fears have been relieved before this, but lest such be not the case I thought it best to write - which I do in great haste - I rec<sup>d</sup> a letter to night from Tho<sup>s</sup> of May 4<sup>th</sup> dated Division Hospital near Kelly's ford - He was wounded thro' the leg - I do not know how seriously as he does not state - suppose it however to be only a flesh wound - Willie Dunklin ditto - Hooper & James P. Hurt - Herbert & Dick Barlow missing - probably prisoners - Paul Rast wounded in two places with grape shot & Matt Fleming killed - Capt Phelan wounded, also Capt Robinson of the Beauregards - The loss of the 3<sup>d</sup> Regt. some 350 or 400 -

We have cause to be devoutly thankful to Almighty God for his signal mercy let us render Him our thanks - Poor Mrs Hardy's how sad the blow fallen upon her - Aunt Rebecca will be miserable but I hope Nat will soon be heard from, I heard to night that Gen Jackson was

dead - I hope sincerely it may be a  
mistake but fear it is so - There is  
much mourning around here for macy  
that fell in the fight - A son of the  
gentleman with whom I am staying  
lost his right leg - Excuse brevity - as  
I write in great haste to get my  
letter in the mail to night - I  
also send a telegraphic despatch  
down to Raleigh to forward on to  
Ma hoping to relieve her anxiety -  
as soon as possible Love to all  
Keep the children for me & re-  
member me to the sisters -
