

A P R O C L A M A T I O N

Amended

BY THE GOVERNOR.

WHEREAS, It is made to appear that Yellow Fever exists in the State of Louisiana,
and,

WHEREAS, the State Board of Health recommends quarantine to the extent hereafter
stated as necessary to the protection of the people of Alabama,

NEW THEREFORE, I, Wm. D. Jelks, Governor of the State of Alabama, pursuant to
the authority in me vested by "An Act To Provide a System of Quarantine for this State",
approved February 23rd, 1899, do hereby proclaim, declare and establish the following
quarantine measures against persons in the State of Louisiana and any other places
in which Yellow Fever exists, to wit: No person from the said State of Louisiana and
other places in which Yellow Fever exists, shall be permitted to enter the limits of
the State of Alabama, except on through trains destined beyond this State.

This quarantine shall be conducted through the State Board of Health, which is
charged with the duty of enforcing such measures not inconsistent with the Constitution
of the State and laws thereof, as it may deem necessary to that end.
