Breager I do appoint him Lieutenant of a volunteer company of infantry under the name of "Jackson Blues" in the 15th Regt of Militia. He is therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of Lieutenant by doing and performing all manner of things thereunto belonging and I do strictly charge and require all officers and soldiers under his command to be obedient to his orders as Lieutenant and he is to obey and follow such orders and directions from time to time as he shall receive from the Governor for the time being or any other superior officer set over him according to the rules and discipline of War. This Commission to continue in force during the pleasure of the Governor for the time being.
