OLIVER LOCK CLOSED FROM 3 TO 7 P.M. FOR FIVE WEEKS

MOBILE, ALA.--Beginning Thursday, June 25, Oliver Lock on the Black Warrior River in Alabama started closing to traffic from 3 to 7 p.m. Monday through Saturday for five weeks, while a contractor is blasting to remove concrete caps from mooring cells nearby in the river.

The Mobile District, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers, advised upbound vessels to hold below the Hunt Oil Company docks, Mile 337.0.

Mariners should contact Oliver Lock and Dam daily for updates to the blasting schedule. Additional bulletins will be issued as conditions warrant.

The Mobile District explained that the contractor for the first phase of construction on the Oliver replacement lock is required to remove the mooring cells located on the east bank below the existing lock.
