Vegetable Enemies.—To destroy bugs on squash and cucumber vines, dissolve a tablespoonful of saltpeper in a pintful of water, and plant this on the ground each time, stirring the earth so that it will not spread. It is also good for the leaves. Use more saltpeper if you can afford it; it is good for vegetable, but deadly to animal life. The bugs hurry by in the evening, and are killed by the morning. It is also good to kill the "grubs" in peach trees—only use twice as much, say a quart or two to a bushel of water. It is also good for the blisters on the leaves of the plum or blistered leaf on twelve or fifteen trees to which it was applied last season.
