## GRANGERS' COLUMN.

### Sweet Potato Culture.

ELMORE CO., 10 miles east of Wetumpka, Ala., Feb. 20, 1874.  
Messrs. Editors:—Last fall when I complimented you with a sample of my Yam potatoes, you extorted a promise from me that I should give you the *modus operandi* of making them, and as the time is close at hand to prepare for the crop, I avail myself of the present moment to give you my plan.

Take the seed potatoes out of the hill on the 15th of March. Make a basin place on the ground, put the potatoes in said basin in a flat bulk. Cover them over with dirt. Let them remain there 10 or 12 days and then dig a pit 4 feet wide and as long as the quantity you wish to plant may require, say 23 bushels per acre, 8 or 10 inches deep. Fill the pit with straw leaves or any vegetable matter mixed with loose dirt raked from the corners of the fence, stamp it down as tight as you can.

Fill the pit with water; lay poles, or plank, or boards by each side, as you will be getting above the level of the earth. Then spread on stable manure, two inches thick, then dirt one inch thick, then place the potato on the dirt, as ordinary bedding. Then cover with dirt two inches; then cover the bed with straw or leaves. Let the top cover remain ten or twelve days; rake it off, and within twenty days from the time of bedding you will have a fine bed of draws to set out, and you will raise twice as many from the above process as on the ordinary plan. Now, by my plan of cultivation, I save one sack of salt on a half acre before breaking the land. After breaking deep with a scotter plow, I then bedded with a turn-plow, like bedded for cotton, rows three feet three inches, checked with a shovel plow three feet three inches, then drew up all the loose dirt with a hoe, and made the old fashioned potato hill. I then cut one draw right on the top of the hill pushed it down deep with a stick. Then cultivate with a hoe by shaving the grass as light as possible. Two shavings will be enough till without drawing any more dirt. The vine should never be covered any and when the vines begin to run take a poker and raise so as to prevent them taking root in the ground. The largest potatoes brought out of \$2 lbs. I weighed what one brought out in several instances, ten and a half was the highest. I sold what was raised on the hill acre, manured with, and planted as before described for \$135. The last I sold on the 3d day of October, I sold for \$1 per bushel. The first lot, \$2.25. There were some 10 or 15 bushels of small potatoes, I did not sell raised on said patch. As I have given my plan of making sweet potatoes I would thank some friend to give me some sure plan to keep the potatoes from rot after being made, the proper time to dig, and the best plan to house, &c.
