by the United States and the citizens

thereof.

of March, in the year of our Lord

one thousand eight hundred and

seventy-four, and of the

Independence of the United

States of America the ninety-

eight.

[RESOLUTION OF GENERAL NATURE—

JOINT RESOLUTION explanatory

of resolution approved January 31,

1868, entitled "A resolution limiting

contracts for stationery and other

supplies in the executive department

to the lowest bidder."

Resolved by the Senate and House

of Representatives of the United States

in Congress assembled, That

the resolution approved January thir-

ty-first, eighteen hundred and sixty-

eight, entitled "A resolution limiting

contracts for stationery and other

supplies in the executive department

to the lowest bidder," shall not be

applied to, or include, mail bags,

mail boxes and keys, postal cards,

and stationery of the United States

Post Office Department.

Approved, February 9, 1874.

[GENERAL NATURE—No. 12]

AN ACT changing the times for hold-

ing certain district courts of the

United States, for the State of Iowa.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House

of Representatives of the United States

in Congress assembled, That

instead of the times now fixed by law,

the district courts of the State of

Iowa, shall hold their terms at the

times hereinafter specified, to wit:

Sec. 1. That all causes, processes, suits,

and proceedings now pending in the

district courts of the State of Iowa,

shall be continued or returned in and

to said courts at the several times here-

in specified.
