Alabama is waking up to a sense of her true interests. The State is wonderfully rich in minerals, water-power and coal, and a recent report prepared by Mr. Thomas Lambert, the commissioner of Industrial Resources, contains some revelations which are calculated to induce a flow of manufacturing capital southward. The fertility of the soil of Alabama is well known, but it has not been generally known that the State could offer such advantages to manufacturers as she undoubtedly can. Iron ore exists there in large quantities. In Cherokee county,

its profit, year by year, is absorbed by others than the tillers of the soil; when the producers grow poorer and poorer, and the non-producers grow rich; when wealth concentrates in the hands of a few—then there is a fundamental error in our financial system; when in an agricultural country like ours a considerable number of citizens possess the power to divert from the ordinary channels of trade a sufficient amount of circulating medium to raise the prices and cause famines, there was some radical wrong; or when the price paid for the use of the circulating medium is so excessive as to be above the profits of the producer, than the system of our currency needs attention.
