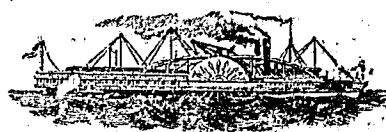

BY TELEGRAPH.

MADRID, May 6.

It is asserted that General Ello, has arrested four Carlist brigadiers for treason, on the ground that they were plotting to overthrow the Government. General Manuel Concha, has been appointed General in Chief of the Republican army of the North. During the bombardment of Bilbao, by the Carlists, one hundred and fifty citizens were killed and wounded by shells which fell in the city.

LITTLE ROCK, May 6.

Baxter's officers refused to obey the habeas corpus for the Supreme Court judges, on the ground that the habeas corpus is under martial law. Baxter has ordered a duplicate of the State seal, which the Brookites captured from the Express office. A general military air prevails.

MEMPHIS, May 6.

The river has fallen two inches, and a steady fall is hoped.

PHILADELPHIA, May 6.

A baseball game resulted--Athletics 24; Baltimore 3.

PARIS, May 6.

Charles Jean Lucien, the French political economist, is dead.

LIVERPOOL, May 6.

The steamship Linda, from Liverpool, is reported on fire at sea. The steamer took off her crew in longitude 41, west.

LONDON, May 6.

American securities unchanged; small sales; street discount below bank rate.

LONDON, May 6.

The London Banking Association has appointed Mr. Tyler, one of the officials of the Board of Trade, to examine into the condition and prospects of the Erie Railroad Company.

INDIANAPOLIS, May 6.

The municipal election to-day was one of the most hotly contested, ever held in the city. The vote was the heaviest ever polled, resulting in a victory for the Democratic and Temperance party. The Democrats elected nine out of thirteen councilmen; the council standing--Democrats, sixteen and Republicans, two. The Democratic candidate for Mayor was also elected. This is the first time in eighteen years that this city has been under Democratic control. The Temperance ticket was elected at Jeffersonville, Peoria, Munice, Waterloo, Anderson, Wabash, New Albany, Franklin, Angola, Madison and Crawfordsville.

WASHINGTON, May 6.

Maj. Theo. H. Shenck, of the U. S. Herald, died last night from apoplexy. In the Senate, from the Finance Committee, reported a new finance bill.
